May her memory be a blessing.






CHAI BOARD OF DIRECTORS ISRAEL TRIP

Dr. Silvana Fenniq, Director Child & Adolescent Psychiatry Dep.

Dr. Silvana Fennig, Director of the Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Department, provided the Board of Directors an update on the Mental Health Pediatric Primary Care Initiative (MHPPC), alongside her colleagues at SCMCI. A partnership between CHAI and SCMCI, MHPPC is an effort to integrate emotional and mental health into all medical care while developing strategies for early detection of mental illness.

As a result of the pilot project, children admitted to the Day Treatment Center are now screened for mental health symptoms. A web site is being developed for physicians and caregivers to provide real-time diagnosis, follow-up, and referrals.

CHAI is proud to support this early intervention project that integrates primary care and behavioral health services to improve children's access to mental health care.
